JULY

- As required by the government, the girls all needed a medical check up. Dr. Budhaditya Chattopadhyay visited to examine and check medications.
- Nabanita, a neighbour and former teacher at Ashok Hall became a volunteer. She helped us create an assessment form for Children's Smart Centre (CSC) and is working on lesson plans. She also works with our Special Educator. She is a welcome addition.
- Mani wants to be a special educator. While she works towards getting the requisite degree for that training, she has begun a certificate course in Yoga, which will broaden her skills as a special educator.

AUGUST

- Traditionally on Rakhi sisters tie rakhis (bracelets) on their brother's wrist, symbolically protecting the boys from harm.



At CSC the children made rakhis and then put them on each other's wrists with the wish for protection of brothers, sisters, and friends.

- Janmashthami is the celebration of the birth of young Lord Krishna. Lord Krishna is placed on a swing and is offered all his favourite items like butter, milk, sweets, coconut ladoos etc. All the Daughters of Shishur Sevay swing Lord Krishna.



- Making standing (vertical) lines is one of the first steps in learning to write. We use chalk on board, pencil on paper, but also magnetic sand for practice.

They wanted to know where their share was! We were stunned. With that money Ganga wanted to buy a toy for the school and Bono wanted KFC. A trip to the mall and its food court followed.

When we talk of quality of life for the children with severe disabilities this is what we mean. They are not alone, they are heard, they joke around like any kid would.

- Shishur Seva received the Times Ascent NGO leadership Award presented by EIILM, Kolkata and organized by World CSR Day. Dr. Harrison accepted the award on behalf of Shishur Seva.



- We had another Parents Teachers' meeting at CSC. We updated the parents about the progress of the children and some of the issues dealing with mobile , saying no. For the children who will be turning five, we discussed plans for admitting them in schools. We also handed out some more of the bilingual materials to take home.



Karate and dance competition took place in the same week.

- Shivaji Ganguly's Academy Mind & Body organized the West Bengal State Karate Full Contact Championship and the West Bengal State Kalahi FMA State Championship. It was supported by the Physical Education Foundation of India a National Sports Promotion Organization recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs Sports, Government of India. Two of the girls bagged silver in karate in their categories and another one bagged a bronze both in the karate and kalahi competitions.

- We visited Sahapur Sabitri Balika Vidyalaya the local government primary school where our girls first attended and we got information for any of the CSC parents who want to send their children there. Shishur Sevay had given the school their first computer.

- Most years, just before Durga Puja holidays begin, the girls and staff of Shishur Sevay go pandal hopping. We could not do it the past two years because of Covid. This year we started our tradition again and took the girls to see the local puja pandals. We planned for two days this time. It was nice to see almost all pandals being accessible.

It was beautiful but also quite hot so some of the girls decided to stay home the second day. That day just five of the girls went. They walked almost 5 kms and saw some of the most popular pandals in South Kolkata. They also ran into friends from dance and yoga classes.

The pandals had beautiful work and with Durga Puja being inscribed on the UNESCO representative list of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2021, the festivities were even more elaborate this year than other years.

THE IMPACT

1. Shishur Seva is the best practices model of inclusive non-institutional care for lost and abandoned girls, some with profound disabilities, all of whom had already been rejected for adoption.
2. We meet or exceed The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and The United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2006 standard.
3. Stigma is one of the major challenges faced by the orphans and the disabled in society. We challenge the stigma by our presence thus promoting inclusivity among the community.
4. Once denied to enter at the community park today we are running an inclusive community free playschool.
